## Features

- There was a growth in grammar schools during the period with children being taught how to read Latin and Greek.
- Philip sent the Duke of Alba with 100,000 men to crush it
- The Crucifixes represented idols and they thought they should not be displayed
- The Act of Uniformity stated that the clergy had to use the Book of Common Prayer
- It was both Catholics and Protestants who were united against Spanish Rule
- They were Catholic conspiracies with the aim of replacing Elizabeth with Mary, Queen of Scots
- The colonists were inexperienced and would not co-operate with each other.
- Elizabeth hired Francis Drake, a privateer, to attack Spain's colonies in the New World
- They were Catholic and planned to replace Elizabeth with Mary, Queen of Scots
- Spain and the French Catholic League signed the Treaty of Joinville
- The vestments worn by priests upset them because they were too elaborate
- Both Philip II and the Pope supported them
- Discipline was harsh with the birch rod being used to beat pupils who did not work hard.
- They left England too late to reach it in time to plant crops
- Towns and cities had to find work for the able bodied poor
- They took control of Durham Cathedral and held a Catholic mass
- There was a national poor rate which sheltered impotent poor
- The Act of Supremacy stated that Elizabeth was Supreme Governor of the Church
