

HOW TO MAKE YOUR OWN FLASH CARDS

Step one: Take a piece of coloured card and fold it in half twice.

Step two: Cut along the folded lines so that you have 4 smaller pieces of card.

Step three: On one side of the card, write one of the questions below.

Step four: Find the answer to the question, then write it in detail on the back of the card. Alternatively, you could write key words/dates on one side and the definitions/events on the other.

Step five: Test yourself or get a friend or family member to test you!

- Recording yourself reading the question + answer on your phone, save the recording and play it on the bus on the way to school.
- Write out the questions and answers in your books.
